Academic success is critical to the mission of Upward Bound! Through our after-school tutoring program, students can work directly with CMU tutors and Upward Bound advisors to not only improve grades but excel in their classes!

In the 2023-2024 school year, 44% of Upward Bound students earned a GPA of 3.0 or above. 20% of Upward Bound students had a GPA of 3.5 or better with 7% students earning a GPA above 4.0.

Donavin, a sophomore at Grand Junction High School, was recognized for his top GPA of 4.4. This year, Donavin plans to continue taking rigorous AP courses and participate in additional extracurricular clubs like Academic Team

Terrence, a junior at Grand Junction High School, maintained his impressive 4.28 GPA while balancing his involvement in AP courses, Academic Team, and FBLA.
