UPWARD BOUND PROGRAM

Instructions for Application

What is Upward Bound?

TRiO Upward Bound (UB) is a federally funded grant sponsored by the Department of Education. UB is designed to support first-generation, and income eligible students prepare to enter and succeed in college. Upward Bound at Colorado Mesa University is a rigorous college preparatory program that assists high school students with academic potential in developing confidence and necessary skills to succeed in high school and college.

Upward Bound participants receive individualized counseling, instruction, and opportunities to enjoy educational and cultural events. UB participants are expected to take a full academic schedule, attend UB events, and fully participate in weekly Upward Bound tutoring and advising. The Upward Bound program also includes a six-week summer program at Colorado Mesa University to help participants grow as students and individuals.

Upward Bound provides the following services and resources:

- Academic tutoring, including reading, writing, study skills, math, science, and more!
- Advisement in preparation for high school and college course selection
- Assistance in preparing for college entrance exams and completing college applications
- Financial literacy training including federal and state financial aid programs, scholarships, and completing the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA)
- College exploration trips to help students find a campus that fits their unique needs
- A six-week summer program including on-campus living, academic instruction, and social activities

Who Can Participate? (Established by Title 34 §645.3 of Code of Federal Regulations)

A student is eligible to participate in the Upward Bound program if they:

- Is enrolled in grades 9-12 at Central or Grand Junction High School
- Is a United States citizen or Permanent Resident
- Meets **one or more** of the three following criteria:
 - Is income eligible, as determined by the limits set forth by federal regulations, or
 - Is first-generation, meaning neither parent/guardian has a 4-year college degree
 - Demonstrates **academic eligibility** (2.5 GPA or below, low standardized test scores, hasn't taken algebra by 10th grade, has a documented disability)

Information for Families and Students

How does Upward Bound work?

During the academic year, Upward Bound provides participants with:

- Academic, personal, and college-prep advising at their high school with an Upward Bound-specific advisor.
- Monthly Saturday sessions to expand college-preparatory skills.
- Educational and cultural events as well as college visits to enrich high school experiences.
- Assistance in college application and financial aid processes for seniors.

During the summer, Upward Bound provides participants with:

- Four weeks of academic instruction in math, science, language arts, and foreign language
- One week of living on-campus and completing college-style classes at Colorado Mesa University
- One week Scholar's trip to visit colleges, cities, and attractions in the Rocky Mountain Region

What will be expected of Upward Bound students?

1. Enroll in eight academic courses every year including math, literature, composition, science, foreign language, and social studies.

Over four years, Upward Bound students will exceed the minimum course load recommended for admission to most Colorado colleges, including:

- 4 years of math (including Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2)
- 4 years of English
- 4 years of social studies (courses like psychology, US history, geography, etc.)
- 2 years of the same foreign language
- 3 years of laboratory science (biology, chemistry, physics, etc.)
- 2. Develop and achieve personal, academic, and college-prep goals with the support of the Upward Bound team and your Upward Bound advisor.
- 3. Participate in all Upward Bound events and activities, including evening and weekend obligations.
- 4. Maintain satisfactory academic progress and consistent class attendance.
- 5. Attend each six-week summer program for the duration of your high school career.
- 6. Treat yourself, other students, and staff with respect, being a positive representative of the program, your high school, and your community.

How can I help my child be successful in Upward Bound?

- Encourage your student to be involved in all aspects of Upward Bound
- Participate in parent/guardian workshops on topics including college preparation, college admissions, financial planning for college, and career exploration.
- Attend events during the academic year and summer program that highlight your student's achievements and performance in the program.
- Meet annually with an Upward Bound advisor and maintain contact on an ongoing basis.

Upward Bound is free of charge. There is no financial obligation for families.


